FSK Foundation Skills Training Package

Delivering better outcomes for learners, trainers and employers

- Focusing attention on the core skills required for vocational competency in supporting the development needs of all learners.
- Enabling more vocational trainers and RTOs to create programs that integrate foundation skills.
- Fostering collaboration between foundation skills practitioners and vocational specialists.
- Prioritising the vocational goals of learners alongside the skilling demands of employers and industry.



Challenges facing FSK



Social, environmental and economic context that IBSA is operating in

- Australia's population is ageing.
- Australians are expected to work for longer.
- There is increased job/career mobility and vulnerability to change.
- The workforce must be highly skilled and adaptable.
- New technologies have changed society, the nature of the workforce and the availability of particular jobs.
- Around 14% of Australians have poor literacy skills.



- An additional 30% of Australians have literacy skills at a level that makes them vulnerable to unemployment and social exclusion.
- Literacy levels are lower amongst older Australians.
- Around 13% of young women and 20% of young men fail to complete school or a vocational equivalent.
- Young people from rural and remote communities are almost 50% less likely to hold either a higher VET qualification or high education qualification than their urban counterparts.
- Indigenous and multicultural communities remain behind national average levels of access and achievement in education and training.
- An ongoing requirement to reduce dependence on government funding.



The challenge we face moving forward as I see it is the

- current lack of funding available for RTOs
- No new Government initiatives
- Impact of inconsistent funding models across jurisdictions,
- Industry upskilling / retraining has to be seen as an investment
- increased need to support documentation and financial literacy needs as well as digital literacy needs, problem solving etc.
- Workforce needs
- higher focus on the LLN needs of workers to re-engage/ retrain more than ever before



What is IBSA doing?

- Released an E-publication for the FSK training package
- Increase the financial and digital literacy components of the FSK units.
- Encourage the continual uptake of FSK with RTOs
- Increase it flexibility and encompass digital portability
- Potential future support resources will be dependent on things –
 - Workforce trends and needs,
 - government funding on educational standards(all levels)
 - Industry support
- Proposed the continuous improvement review of the FSK Qualifications
